The highlight this fall has been the missions outreach project – “*Totes for Tents for Turkey*” – where the group raised over \$5700 for the Turkish Earthquake victims through the sale of reusable, cloth Christmas Gift Bags. All materials and labour were donated (through contacts with Nancy’s business) and so all the proceeds will be going directly to the earthquake victims for the purchase of tents for their long-term use as more permanent dwellings are gradually rebuilt.



## Jordan








## Timothy
